There are so many Bible study resources and instead of getting stuck on where to start, we want to offer you a simple next step.

If you were to take one small step today, we would encourage you to start with a short Scripture passage, like John 3:16-17.

"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him" John 3:16-17 (NIV).

Then take this passage through an easy to follow resource the Four Rs of Bible Study:

- 1. Read,
- 2. Reflect,
- 3. Respond,
- 4. Rest in God's Word.


If you like using the *Four Rs of Bible Study*, then try using it while reading through small sections of Scripture from one of the Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, or John).

There are a variety of ways to study the Bible. An easy first step for understanding the different ways you can learn from the Bible is through *The Word Hand*.

"Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ" Romans 10:17 (NIV).


Use the Scriptures, like Romans 10:17 (included in *The Word Hand* resource) to try out these five methods of learning from the Bible: Hearing, reading, studying, memorizing, and meditation.

"The precepts of the LORD are right, giving joy to the heart. The commands of the LORD are radiant, giving light to the eyes" Psalm 19:8 (NIV).

A great first step for cultivating time with God and a Bible study habit is to make a routine appointment in your calendar, just like you would for spending time with a friend.

"'I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing" John 15:5 (NIV).




