1) Sacrificial Service

Maturing in Sacrificial Service means learning how to better offer our gifts in service to others. (1 Peter 4:10-11)

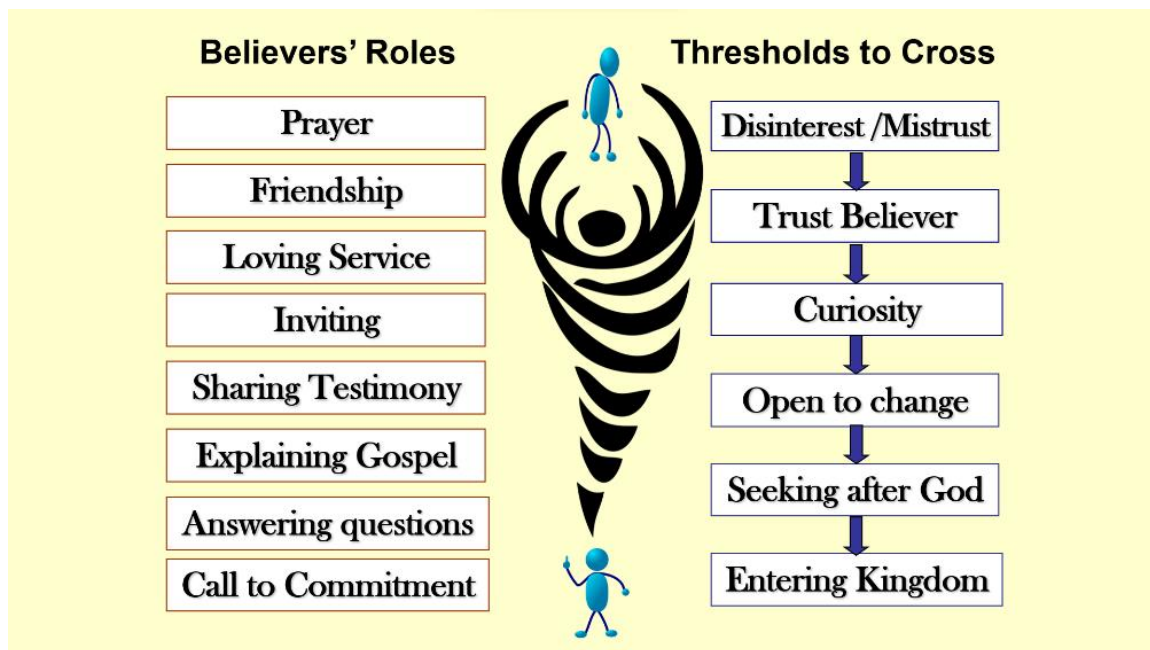
2. Committed Fellowship

3. Intentional Evangelism

Because we are already “salt” and “light”, we can immediately begin to evangelize and allow our experiences to motivate us in our continual pursuit of becoming a mature multiplying disciple. (Matthew 5:14-16)
